SUBJECT INFORMATION

Honors & Advanced-Level Courses: All courses at AFA are taught by default at an Honors level. Honors level courses are academically rigorous and reflect our commitment to providing an excellent and challenging education. Many high school courses are offered at an Advanced level for students who desire to challenge themselves to the maximum possible degree. These courses move at a faster pace, require more reading and writing, and require students to direct their own learning to a greater extent. To reflect this, Advanced courses are calculated with a 0.5 boost to their base GPA value. We offer Advanced courses in 9th-12th History and Literature, 12th Science, Calculus, and Latin V.

History & Literature: 9th and 10th grade students combine in their study of Literature and History, split into two courses based on academic level (Honors or Advanced) rather than grade. 11th and 12th grade students do the same. This enables us to differentiate between the academic levels.

Mathematics: Students take Mathematics courses based on their grade level. We do not permit students to take courses outside of their grade level. This enables us to maximize our staff and build clean, consistent schedules for our students. A student's level in Mathematics will be a determining factor in their grade placement at AFA.

Science: Students begin taking lab sciences in 8th grade with Physical Science before progressing through Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. In their Senior year, students have the option to take an Advanced Science Option that varies year-to-year based on staff.

Latin: Students begin Latin I for HS credit in 8th grade. High school students transferring into AFA may take Latin I if entering in 9th or 10th grade. Three years of high school credit in a foreign language are required for graduation from AFA. Juniors who transfer into AFA may take outside credit to complete a third year of a non-Latin foreign language if necessary.
